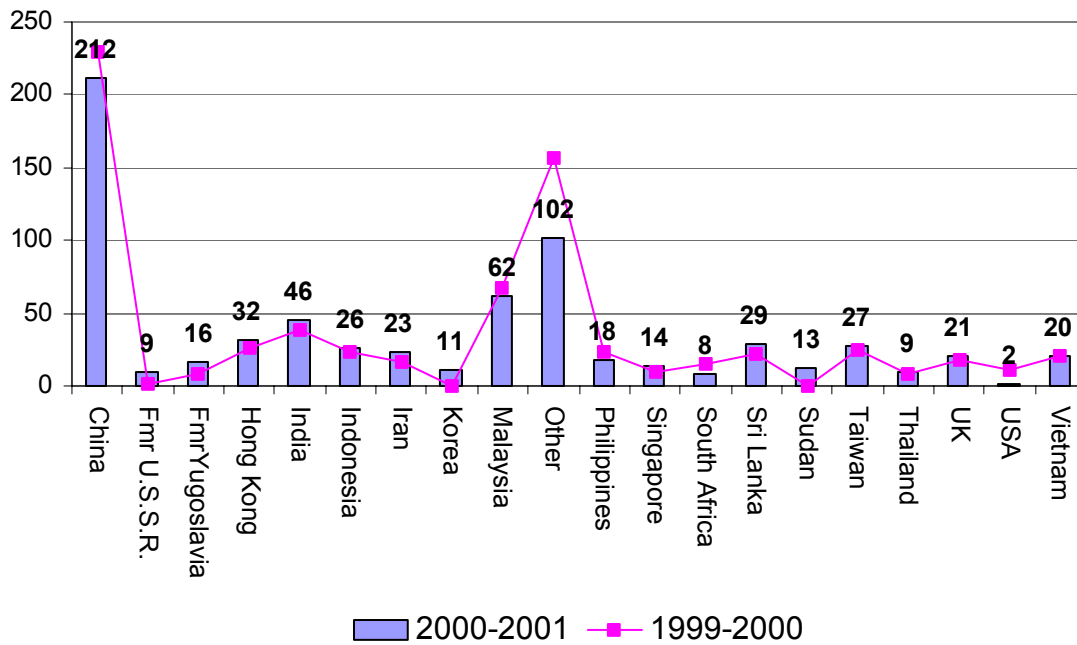


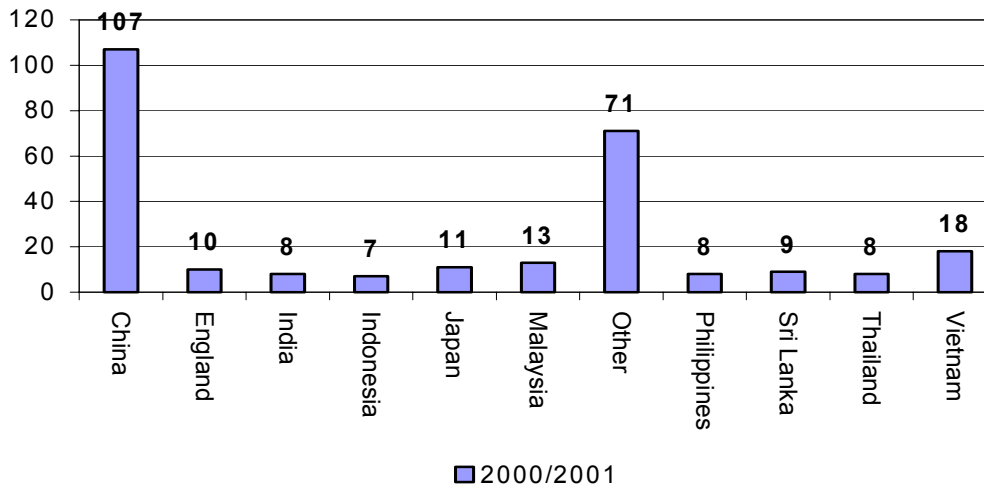
### 1.1 Total Migration to the City of Whitehorse 1999/00 and 2000/01<sup>1</sup>

A total of 700 people indicated that they would settle in the City of Whitehorse on entering Australia in 2000/01. This compares to 710 people in the year ending June 2000. In 2000/01 the largest number of people came from China representing 30% of the total.

### 1.2 Family Migration to the City of Whitehorse in 2000/01

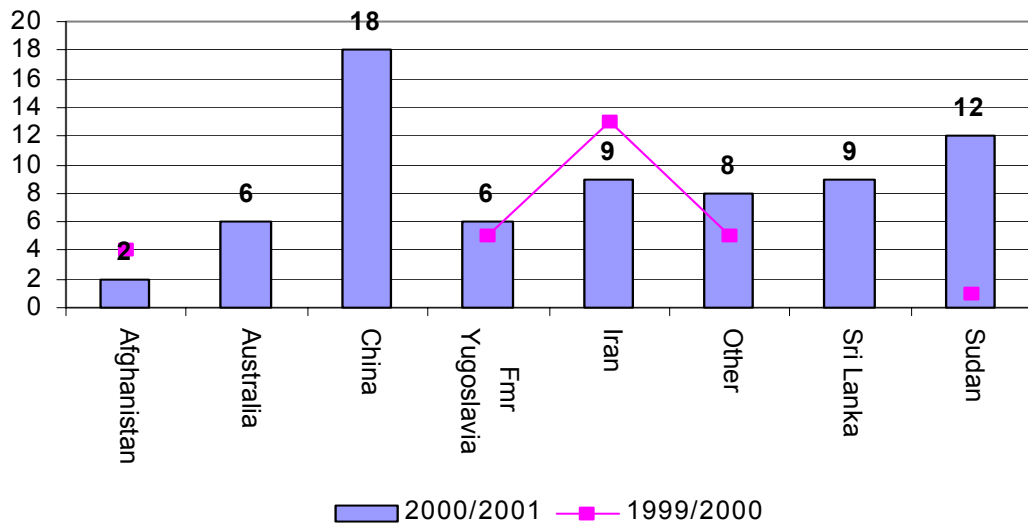

A total of 280 people indicated that they would settle in the City of Whitehorse on entering Australia through Family Migration in 2000/01. In 2000/01 the largest number of people were born in China, representing 38% of all entrants.

The figures on all graphs may be slightly under or over estimated as where DIMA has not indicated the figure it is assumed that the figure is 2 people i.e. it could be 1, 2, or 3 people.

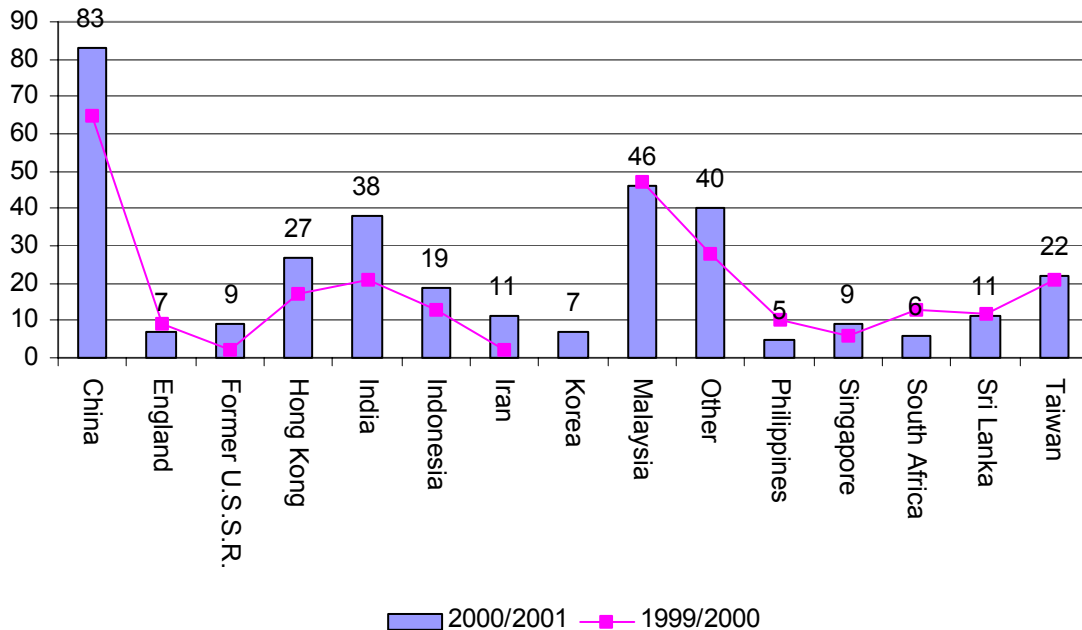
### 1.3 Humanitarian Entrants to the City of Whitehorse 1999/00 and 2000/01

A total of 70 people indicated that they would settle in the City of Whitehorse on entering Australia through the Humanitarian program in 1999/00. This compares to 28 people in the year ending June 2000. In 2000/01 the largest number of entrants (26%) were born in China.

### 1.4 Skilled Migration to the City of Whitehorse 1999/00 and 2000/01

A total of 340 people indicated that they would settle in the City of Whitehorse on entering Australia through the Skilled Migration Program in 2000/2001. This compares to 266 people in the year ending June 2000. In 2000/01 the largest number of people were born in China, representing 24% of all entrants.
