What Community Connectors Can Do

- ◆ Help build better community awareness of the NDIS
- ◆ Assist individuals, their families and/or carers to complete an NDIS Access Request Form
- ◆ Assist individuals, their families, carers and representatives to attend assessments and collect medical evidence that will support their NDIS application
- ◆ Attend NDIS pre-planning, planning, and review meetings if clients would like our help
- ◆ Connect people with NDIS service providers
- ◆ Assist disability service providers to better engage with people from CALD backgrounds to NDIS services
