5 easy ways to present a warm, welcoming and inclusive environment

- Display a welcome poster in other languages
- Translate promotional materials in key community languages and visit culturally diverse communities in your area to tell them what you do
- Invite culturally diverse communities to visit your organisation
- Use images of people from other cultures in your reception area, promotional materials, newsletters and website
- Welcome all clients in a warm and friendly manner

Limited English does not need to be an obstacle to volunteering

How will your organisation benefit?

You will:

- Gain new volunteers with unique and different skills
- Be able to plan and deliver more culturally appropriate services
- Be able to promote your services to CALD communities and improve access
- Build a greater awareness of other cultures in your organisation and the wider community
- Have greater opportunities for innovative activities and partnerships with ethno-specific communities and organisations

Strategies to implement in the workplace:

- Pass on information face to face
- Provide a short summary of key policies and procedures in plain English using symbols and pictures
- Use a buddy or mentor to support the volunteer
- Encourage staff and other volunteers to attend cross cultural training
- Use the skills of existing bilingual staff and volunteers
- Welcome cultural diversity and celebrate special cultural days

Focus on the capabilities of the individual, not their limitations
