COMMUNITY EMPLOYMENT CONNECTOR PROGRAM

An individualised service for people from culturally and linguistically diverse backgrounds who are seeking support to connect with employment and training services

THE MIC COMMUNITY EMPLOYMENT CONNECTOR

Supports people who are:

- Currently working, but considering a change of career/job in the future
- Underemployed (i.e. you are working fewer hours than you would like)
- A long-term unemployed jobseeker
- Currently out of the labour market but planning to re-enter the workforce
- Undertaking post-secondary study but you are unsure of your work options
- A retrenched worker
- Not currently engaging in education or training
- Not eligible for Commonwealth employment services
- A jobseeker with multiple and/or complex barriers to employment

From a culturally and linguistically diverse (CALD) background, aged over 16 years, and facing barriers to securing sustainable employment

And

Live in the Eastern Metropolitan Region of Melbourne (Boroondara, Knox, Manningham, Maroondah, Monash, Whitehorse or Yarra Ranges)



The MIC Community Employment Connector (CEC) will help people from CALD backgrounds negotiate available employment and training services via proactive outreach.

The CEC can provide information and refer you to relevant employment, training, education and social support services

The CEC can assist you to complete forms and call relevant services in order to link you to employment, training, education and social support services
